intransitive

To get older and bigger

She is growing up so fast.

to live with

transitive - inseparable

To sleep and be in the same house

I live with my parents.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to get on/along with

transitive - inseparable

To have a good relationship

I get along well with my siblings.

to count on

transitive - inseparable

To rely or depend on

I count on my parents.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to take after

transitive - inseparable

To be very similar to

She takes after her mother.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to fall out with

transitive - inseparable

To have an argument

I fell out with my father.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to argue with

transitive - inseparable

To express opposite views

I always argue with my brother.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to rebel against

transitive - inseparable

To disobey

He rebelled against me.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to tell off

transitive - separable

To reprimand

She is always telling me off.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to look after

transitive - inseparable

To provide for

I looked after her when you were on holiday.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to look up to

transitive - inseparable

To admire

I look up to my boss.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to settle down

intransitive

To begin a quieter, calmer, more stable life

I want to settle down now.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to look back on

transitive - inseparable

To think of the past

We'll look back on this moment in time.

Phrasal Verbs for Family

to stick together

intransitive

To remain united

We will always stick together.

to split up

intransitive

To separate

I want to split up.
