

Past Perfect Continuous Keywords



There are lots of keywords that can be used in the past perfect continuous tense. Let's take a look!







When is used with the past simple, most recent part of the sentence.


We had been going out for 5 years <u>when</u> he asked me to marry him.





Since must be followed by a fixed past time phrase. It's used with the first event.

We had been reading that book <u>since</u> December, but we finished it last night.





For must be followed by a countable time phrase. It's used with the first event.

He had been practising <u>for</u> 5 hours before he did his audition.





Before is used with the past simple, most recent part of the sentence.

Her sale numbers had been improving <u>before</u> she got fired.





After is used with the past perfect continuous, the first event.

She started some work <u>after</u> she had been relaxing all day.
