

Present Continuous v Present Perfect Continuous Forms



The present continuous and the present perfect continuous tenses have different forms. Let's review them.



AFFIRMATIVE

Present Continuous	Present Perfect Continuous	
I am walking	I have been walking	
You are walking	You have been walking	
He is walking	He has been walking	
She is walking	She has been walking	
It is walking	It has been walking	
We are walking	We have been walking	
They are walking	They have been walking	



NEGATIVE

Present Continuous	Present Perfect Continuous	
I'm not walking	I haven't been walking	
You aren't walking	You haven't been walking	
He isn't walking	He hasn't been walking	
She isn't walking	She hasn't been walking	
It isn't walking	It hasn't been walking	
We aren't walking	We haven't been walking	
They aren't walking	They haven't been walking
