

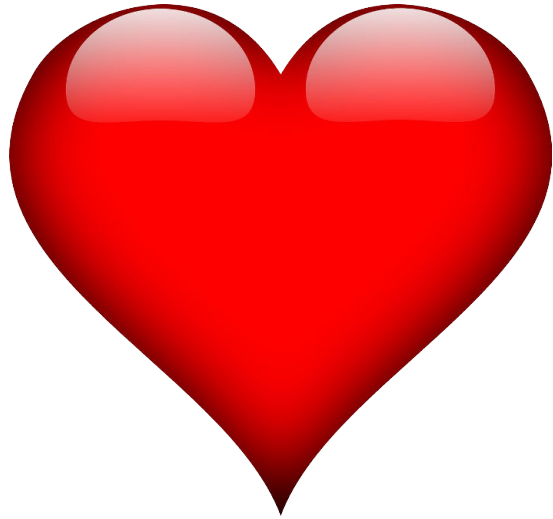


Friends Idioms

Native speakers use idioms in everyday conversations.

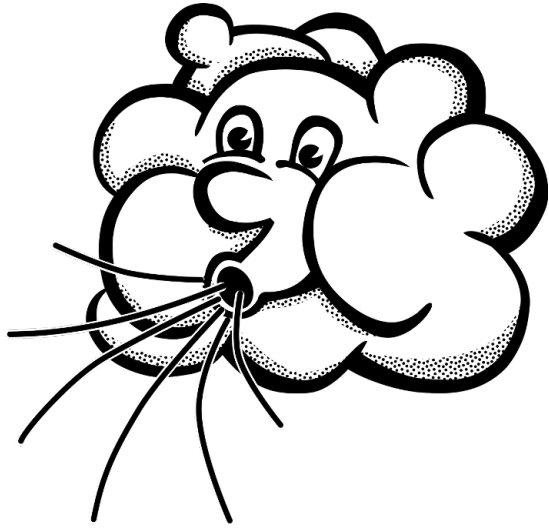
No love lost

party.*

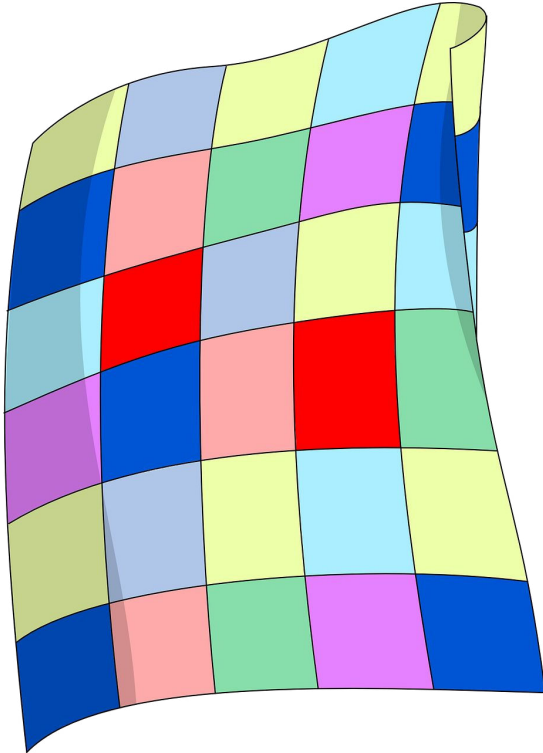
To bury the hatchet

Let's bury the hatchet.

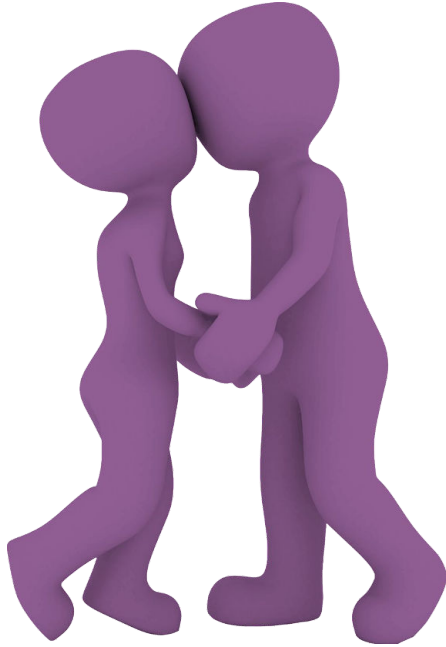
To patch up one's differences

We disagree on a lot of things but we're patching up our differences.

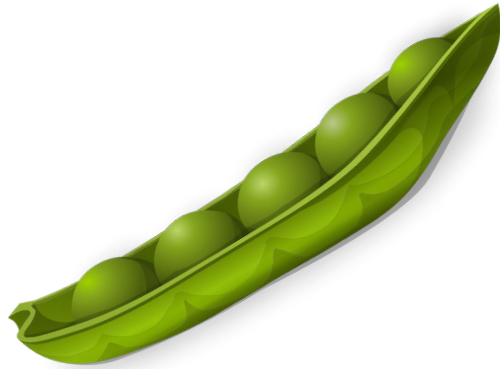
Through thick and thin
