	Present Tense	Past Tense	Future Tense
Simple form	(Why) Do you walk? (Why) Does he walk? (Why) Is he happy?	(Why) Did you walk? (Why) Was he happy?	(Why) Will I walk?
Continuous form	(Why) Am I walking? (Why) Are you walking? (Why) Is he walking?	(Why) Was I walking? (Why) Were you walking?	(Why) Will I be walking?
Perfect form	(Why) Have I walked? (Why) Has he walked?	(Why) Had I walked?	(Why) Will I have walked?
Perfect Continuous form	(Why) Have I been walking? (Why) Has he been walking?	(Why) Had I been walking?	(Why) Will I have been walking?



LOOK OUT

- ⚠ Question words what, which and how can insert objects
- ⚠ Prepositions should be at the end of the question
- ⚠ Negative questions change the auxiliary in each tense to the negative form
- ⚠ Natives may drop the auxiliary verb
- ⚠ Modals and conditionals require the auxiliary before the subject
- ⚠ Question tags must have matching subjects and auxiliary verbs
- ⚠ Indirect questions don't require an inversion of the subject and verb
- ⚠ You can use intonation to turn a statement into a question
