Situation: Asking a guest to take a seat in a formal but friendly way.

## 6. You're coming, aren't you?

Situation: Checking if a friend will attend the weekend party.

## 7. I think it might work...

Situation: Discussing a tentative plan with a colleague.

## 8. Oh no, not again

Situation: Frustrated reaction when a meeting is postponed for the third time.

## 9. Really? You went there alone

Situation: Surprised that someone traveled to a new city by themselves.



## 10. Well, I suppose we could try it

Situation: Suggesting a cautious approach to a new idea in a group.

## 11.I said I like apples, not oranges

Situation: Correcting someone politely but firmly about your preference.

#### 12. We bought apples, oranges, and bananas

Situation: Listing items you purchased, natural rise on each item, fall on last.

## 13. That wasn't what I expected

Situation: Feeling disappointed when a restaurant order is wrong.

## 14.I can't wait to see the movie

Situation: Expressing excitement to a friend.

# 15. Maybe we should reconsider

Situation: Suggesting hesitation or doubt during a team discussion.

#### 16. You saw him?

Situation: Surprised reaction to hearing news about a mutual friend.

# 17. Fantastic job

Situation: Praising a colleague sincerely after a successful report.

# 18.I guess we'll see what happens

Situation: Hesitant comment about an uncertain situation.

## 19. Oh, that's wonderful

Situation: Reacting enthusiastically to a friend's good news.

## 20. Sure, that makes sense

Situation: Responding to a suggestion, possibly with slight sarcasm depending on context.
