to log in

intransitive

To access a system using your username/password

I always log in to my computer in the mornings.



to log out

intransitive

To exit from a system

I log out at the end of each day.



to sign up

intransitive

To register for a service

I will sign up to their mailing list.



to back up

transitive - separable

To make a copy to prevent data loss

I must back my files up later today.



to plug in

transitive - separable

To connect an electrical device to a power source.

Can you plug my charger in?



to set up

transitive - separable

To install, prepare or arrange for use

I need to set up my new computer.



to turn on

transitive - separable

To start a device/system

Can you turn my laptop on, please?



to turn off

transitive - separable

To stop a device/system

Can you turn off laptop on, please?



to lock up

intransitive

When a device/program freezes

My computer has locked up again.



to break down

intransitive

When a device/program stops working

My computer has completely broken down.



to load up

transitive - separable

To start a program so it's ready to use

Can you load the documents up ready for the meeting?

to shut down

transitive - separable

To turn off a device completely

Let's shut down the computer.



to run out of

transitive - inseparable

To use all of a supply

My laptop has run out of battery.



to pop up

intransitive

To appear suddenly

This message has popped up on my screen.



to go off

intransitive

To start suddenly (alarms/notifications/devices)

The alarm is going off!



Computer Problems and Solutions





The screen is **frozen** and I can't click on anything.

- Sometimes a small glitch causes freezing try to restart the computer.
- Close any apps that are using too much RAM.
- Check if your **OS** needs an update.

Frozen: When a computer or app stops responding

Glitch: Small temporary error

Restart: To turn a computer off and back on again

RAM: Short-term computer memory used to run programs quickly

OS (Operating System): Main software that controls the computer

My computer is running slowly

- Close unnecessary tabs and windows.
- Check how much storage you have left.
- Delete temporary data files.
- Restart the router if websites load slowly.

Window: Open box on your screen

Data file: File that stores information created by a user



I can't connect to the Wi-Fi

- Restart your router.
- Forget the network and log in again.
- Check your password is correct.
- Make sure Airplane Mode isn't on.
- Sometimes the server might be down wait or contact your provider.

Password: A secret string on characters used to access an account

Airplane Mode: A setting that turns off wireless connections on a device

Server: A powerful computer that stores data allowing other computers to access them over a network



The app keeps crashing

- Update the app.
- Reinstall it (uninstall → install).
- Check for OS updates.
- Look for known bugs in the app or software notes online.

To crash: To suddenly stop working and close unexpectedly

Bug: Error in software that makes it behave incorrectly



I'm out of storage

- Delete old files / videos.
- Move items to cloud storage.
- Empty the recycle bin / trash.

Out of storage: When a device has no more space left to save new data

Cloud storage: A service that lets you save files online so you can access them from any device with an Internet connection

Recycle bin/trash: A folder where deleted files go before permanent deletion



My laptop **overheats**

- Make sure vents aren't blocked.
- Reduce the number of apps running at the same time.
- Use a cooling pad if necessary.

To overheat: To get too hot causing damage

Vent: An opening on the computer that allows hot air to escape

Cooling pad: A device that helps reduce heat, usually by blowing cold air or providing a cooler surface



My headphones won't connect

- Turn Bluetooth off and on.
- Make sure devices are paired correctly.
- Restart the computer or device.

Paired: Connected, usually wirelessly



The printer isn't responding

- Check the cable connection or Wi-Fi.
- Make sure the printer has paper and ink.
- Restart the printer and computer.

Not responding: When a program stops working temporarily ad doesn't erect to clicks or commands



My file won't open

- Make sure the file format is supported by your app.
- Check if the data is corrupted.
- Try opening it on another device.

Corrupted: When data becomes damaged and cannot be opened or used properly



I think someone has hacked my account

- Change your password immediately. Try using secure passwords.
- Check for suspicious activity on your server or account
- Enable two-factor authentication.

Hacked: A computer system has been illegally accessed

Two-factor authentication (2FA): A security method that requires two types of verification to access an account



I keep getting spam emails

- Mark suspicious emails as spam.
- Do not click any links or download attachments.
- Set up an email filter to block unwanted messages.

Spam: Unwanted or irrelevant emails, messages, often sent in bulk



My browser shows annoying **pop-ups**

Enable a pop-up blocker in your browser.

Turn off notifications.

Clear your cache and cookies regularly.

Avoid clicking on suspicious ads or links.

Pop-up: A small window that appears on your screen

Pop-up blocker: A feature to prevent pop-ups from appearing

Notification: Message

Cache: Temporary files stored on your browser/device to make loading faster

Cookies: Small files saved by websites to remember information

Websites are tracking my browsing history

- Use incognito mode for private browsing.
- Clear your browsing history, cache, and cookies regularly.
- Adjust your browser privacy settings to limit tracking.

Browsing history: A record of all websites you've visited on your browser

Incognito mode: A private browsing mode where history, cookies and cache aren't saved
