## Subject Pronouns

These refer to a very specific person  
who completes an action

*I, you, he, she, it, we, they*

# What Is An Object Pronoun?

## Possessive Pronouns

These refer to a very specific person  
who owns a noun

*my, your, his, her, its, our, their*



# What Is An Object Pronoun?

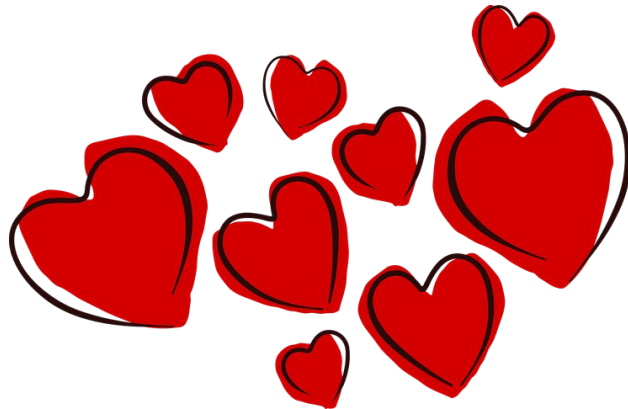
## Object Pronouns

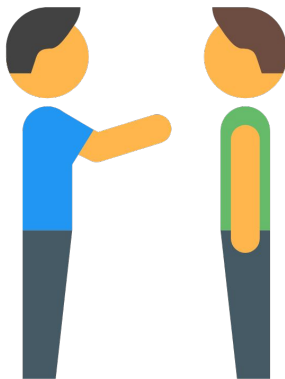

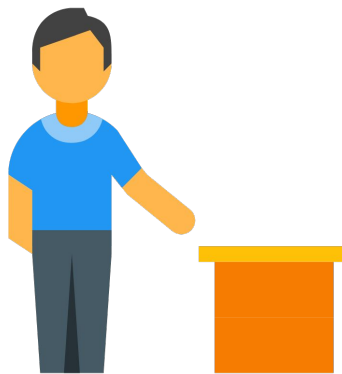

# Object Pronouns

| Subject Pronoun<br>(completes the action =<br>+ verb) | Possessive Pronoun<br>(end of a sentence) -<br>replace a noun | Possessive Adjective<br>( + noun) - my car, their<br>house | Object Pronoun<br>he loves me<br>End of a sentence -<br>receives the action |
|---|---|--|---|
| I   | mine  | my   | me  |
| you   | yours   | your   | you   |
| he  | his   | his  | him   |
| she   | hers  | her  | her   |
| it  | its   | its  | it  |
| we  | ours  | our  | us  |
| they  | theirs  | their  | them  |

# Object Pronouns

| Subject Pronoun | Possessive Pronoun | Possessive Adjective | Object Pronoun |
|-----------------|--------------------|----------------------|----------------|
| I               | mine               | my                   | me             |
| you             | yours              | your                 | you            |
| he              | his                | his                  | him            |
| she             | hers               | her                  | her            |
| it              | its                | its                  | it             |
| we              | ours               | our                  | us             |
| they            | their              | their                | them           |



## Using Pronouns

**Subject pronouns** are used before a verb and are often found at the beginning of a sentence.

*I go to the supermarket regularly.*

# Using Pronouns

**Possessive adjectives** are used immediately before a noun to show possession and ownership.

*This is **my** house.*

## Using Pronouns

**Possessive pronouns** are used to talk about a previously mentioned noun and show possession.

*This house is mine.*

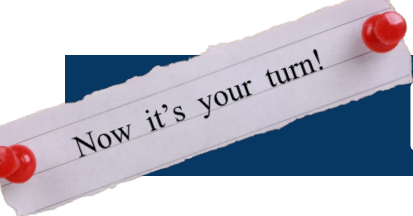
## Using Pronouns

**Object pronouns** are used to talk about the person who receives an action. This is normally after a verb.

*They love **him**.*

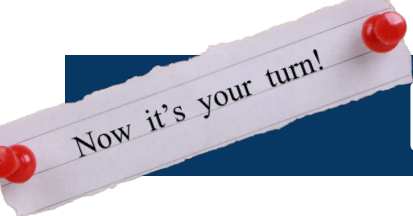
