# **Subject Pronouns**

These refer to a very specific person who completes an action

I, you, he, she, it, we, they



### **Possessive Pronouns**

These refer to a very specific person who owns a noun

my, your, his, her, its, our, their




# **Object Pronouns**

These refer to a very specific person who receives the action in a sentence. This is what you're going to learn in this course.







Who's there? It's us!



Subject Pronoun (completes the action = + verb)	Possessive Pronoun (end of a sentence) - replace a noun	Possessive Adjective ( + noun) - my car, their house	Object Pronoun he loves me End of a sentence - receives the action
I	mine	my	me
you	yours	your	you
he	his	his	him
she	hers	her	her
it	its	its	it
we	ours	our	us
they	theirs	their	them

Subject Pronoun	Possessive Pronoun	Possessive Adjective	Object Pronoun
I	mine	my	me
you	yours	your	you
he	his	his	him
she	hers	her	her
it	its	its	it
we	ours	our	us
they	their	their	them



Subject pronouns are used before a verb and are often found at the beginning of a sentence.

I go to the supermarket regularly.



Possessive adjectives are used immediately before a noun to show possession and ownership.

This is my house.



Possessive pronouns are used to talk about a <u>previously mentioned</u> noun and show possession.

This house is mine.



Object pronouns are used to talk about the person who <u>receives an</u> action. This is <u>normally after a verb</u>.

They love him.
