




What is a preposition of time?

At is used for very specific time expressions

On is used for not very specific time expressions





In is used for very broad time expressions



The preposition "in" is used in these situations

- 1) Years
- 2) Months
- 3) Decades
- 4) Centuries
- 5) Eras

- 6) Periods of time
- 7) Seasons
- 8) Times of the day



The preposition "on" is used in these situations

- 1) Days
- 2) Dates
- 3) 1 day specific event



The preposition "at" is used in these situations

- 1) Time
- 2) Specific time of day
- 3) Mealtimes
- 4) Holiday period (longer than 1 day)



There are some exception time phrases that also use "at".

AT NIGHT



YESTERDAY


Yesterday, we went to the city.

TODAY

I am studying today.





LAST + TIME PHRASE

Last week I went to the supermarket.





NEXT + TIME PHRASE

Next summer, I will travel to France.





THIS + TIME PHRASE

This week, I will buy a puppy.





EVERY + TIME PHRASE

I brush my teeth every day.
