Sentence Structure

1. **Noun** → person, animal, place, thing, idea
2. **Verb** → action, feeling, process, state, happening
3. **Subject** → name, noun, noun phrase, pronoun
4. **Adjective** → describes a noun
5. **Adverb** → time, manner or place to add information
