



Advertisement

A piece of paper that summarises everything you want to buy, but you haven't bought it yet. This is typical in the service industry e.g. at a restaurant/bar.

Bill

A notice that promotes a certain brand or shop. This could be on paper, on TV or online.

Cashier

A person who works at a checkout inside a shop.



Customer

A reduced price on a product/service.

Discount

A person who is interested in buying something in a shop.

Cheap

Something with a very low price.



Sale

To pay

Expensive

This is a verb to say that you give money to somebody in return for a product/service.

A short period of time when products/services have a reduced price. We can use the expression "to be on sale" or something is "for sale".

This is an adjective to say that something has a very high price.


