What Is A Conditional?

A conditional is a very special type of sentence in English. It is used to express that an action happens based on a condition. In other words, event B (the result) only happens if event A (the condition) happens.

What Is A Conditional?

There are five types of conditional sentences in English;

Zero Conditional

First Conditional

Second Conditional

Third Conditional

Mixed Conditional



What Is A Conditional?

Each of these conditional sentences uses a different structure (different tenses) to express a different sequence of events.

What Is A Conditional?

Conditional sentences also include a conditional conjunction. The most common conditional conjunctions are **IF** and **WHEN**, which is what we'll use in this course today.


