



We use commas to separate the tens. A full stop is used as a decimal point.

We can use numbers as adjectives in English



He earns a salary that is six figures.

Hyphenate the number



He earns a salary that is six-figures.

Put the adjective before the noun





He earns a six-figures salary.

Adjectives are always singular in English!





He earns a six-figure salary.

Now our adjective is being used correctly!

Numbers bigger than 10 are written as digits






If the number starts the sentence it should always be written as a word
