All your healthcare details will be stored with your doctor. Each person has a specific doctor called a general practitioner (GP), so when you book an appointment you will always see the same doctor. If you have any minor problems, you can book your appointment and your doctor will provide you with treatment.

If you need additional medication this is free if you are; under 16 years old, 16-18 years and in full-time education, older than 60 years old, pregnant or are receiving financial support from the government. 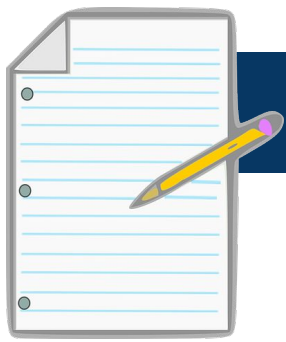
