






#### Learn, Study and Teach

**Teach** is used when you explain or provide information about a topic or subject.



I teach maths.



#### Learn, Study and Teach

**Study** is used for the first time you receive information about a subject/topic. (i.e. new information) This could be done by reading, watching videos, listening to a teacher.

I am studying the present tense in English.



#### Learn, Study and Teach

**Learn** is the process after studying, when you fully understand and have knowledge of a topic or subject.



I have now learnt the present simple tense in English.

# The 11+ exam is compulsory across the country

#### **FALSE**



In the past, there was a compulsory exam called the 11+, which was to test the education and skills of a child after primary school. This is no longer an official state exam.

The most important stage of secondary school is Key Stage 4, which focuses on the skills required to pass the compulsory state exams at the age of 15/16 - GCSEs (General Certificate of Secondary Education).



GCSEs are currently marked from A\* (best grade) to G (worst grade)

# GCSEs are currently marked from A\* (best grade) to G (worst grade)

#### **FALSE**



In the past, GCSEs were marked from A\* (the best) to G (the worst) but the system recently changed to a number marking system instead. Now, grade 1 is the best and grade 9 is the worst, with 5 being an average pass.

There are some alternatives to sixth form though, some students move to a vocational or technical college instead and take BTECs (Business and Technology Education Council). ... Although A-levels and BTECs are the most popular further education qualifications, there are many more that exist. For example, City and Guilds, T-levels, the IB (International Baccalaureate) or other diplomas or licences.
