There are five types of conditional sentences in English;

Zero Conditional

First Conditional

Second Conditional

Third Conditional

Mixed Conditional



The zero conditional is used to express a truth or fact. You'll typically find it in academic writing.



Zero conditional sentences use the present simple tense in both parts of the sentence.

If + present simple

present simple

If you mix red and blue, you get purple



Remember these phrases can be flipped around too.

present simple

If + present simple

You get purple if you mix red and blue.



The first conditional is used to express a very likely future event.

More specifically, it's used for threats, promises, to persuade somebody and future plans.



The conjunction (typically if) is used with the present simple and the second part is will/won't.

If + present simple

won't + infinitive

If you are naughty, Santa won't deliver presents



Remember these sentences can be flipped around too.

won't + infinitive

Santa won't deliver presents

If + present simple

if you are naughty



We don't always have to use will/won't.

Sometimes we can use might or may + infinitive to add a bit more doubt.



If it rains, we might have the party inside

100%

If it rains, we will have the party inside

The key difference between these two tenses is the likelihood of something happening in the future.



Zero Conditional	First Conditional
Truth or fact (100% going to happen)	Very likely future event (80-99% going to happen)



In zero conditional, for example, this sentence is presented as a fact, a truth. This means it is going to happen.

If you **sit** in the sun for 10 hours, you **burn**.



In first conditional, for example, this sentence is presented as a very likely future event, not 100% certain.

If you **sit** in the sun for 10 hours, you will burn.






Zero Conditional	First Conditional
General statement	Personal statement for a particular situation



In zero conditional, for example, this sentence is very general and applicable to anybody.

If you **sit** in the sun for 10 hours, you **burn**.



In first conditional, for example, this sentence is more personal and used in a particular situation. If you're talking to an individual, warning them, you would use the first conditional.

If you **sit** in the sun for 10 hours, you **will burn**.



Zero Conditional	First Conditional
General statement	Personal statement for a particular situation



If ice-cream gets

If your ice-cream warm, it melts. gets warm, it will melt.



Zero Conditional	First Conditional
General statement	Personal statement for a particular situation

If you drive drunk and see a police office, you go to jail

If you drive drunk, you will have an accident




