Adverbs of Manner

Irregular

Adjective	Adverb of Manner	Example	LY Ending	LY Meaning
Hard	Hard	I work hard	Hard <u>ly</u>	rarely / not often
Late	Late	I stayed up late	Lately	Recently
High	High	We flew high up	Highly	Very
Most	Most	I like this most	Mostly	Mainly
Near	Near	He drove very near	Nearly	Almost
Short	Short	I've come up short	Shortly	Soon

I work hard → subject + verb + adverb of manner → lots of effort / long hours

I work hardly → subject + verb + adverb of frequency → rarely, don't work a lot, short hours, no effort

Adverbs of Manner

intransitive verb + adverb

She sings beautifully

They speak badly

He painted artistically

Adverbs of Manner

transitive verb + object + adverb

He stroked **the dog** gently

He said **it** publicly

Adverbs of Manner

adverb + transitive verb + object

He gently stroked **the dog**

He publicly said **it**

Adverbs of Manner

**NOT USED WITH LINKING
VERBS**

(linking verb + noun/adj)
