This is **American English** for a building where you can watch new films/movies.




CINEMA

This is **British English** for a building where you can watch new films/movies.



intransitive

To relax

Let's sit back this afternoon

Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

To nod off

intransitive

To briefly sleep

Please don't nod off!

Phrasal Verbs for Cinema

To sleep through

transitive - inseparable

To sleep with noise in the background

We slept through the storm

To leave a place


