


Household Chores

What are household chores?




Laundry



To do the laundry, you may need to put stain remover on the clothes before you load the washing machine and add detergent. Once the clothes are washed, you can hang them up on the washing line with pegs or hangers, put them on a drying rack or in a clothes dryer. Finally, they need to be ironed on the ironing board or folded up and put away.

Around The House




To keep the house clean I often wipe the surfaces with a cloth and cleaning spray. When something is very dirty, I use bleach. I need to sweep the floor with a sweeping brush and sometimes I scrub then mop the floor. I also polish things in my house and dust. I tidy my house, vacuum it and take the rubbish out too.

In The Kitchen/ Dining Room


