



What is a minimal pair?

(Hint: pronunciation)



A minimal pair is when we have a pair of words with only one phonological difference.

This changes the pronunciation of the word but also the meaning.



In the example below, one change in consonant totally changes the word.

It doesn't always have to be a consonant, it could be a vowel change.








And it doesn't always have to be in the middle of a word, it could be at the beginning ...




