

Why are there keys here. Are they yours?



2) Answering a question about possession

Whose book is this?

It's mine!



3) To avoid repetition

This is <u>my dog</u> and that is <u>her dog</u>. This is my dog and that is **hers**.



Why are there <u>keys</u> here. Are they **yours**?

Whose <u>book</u> is this? It's mine!

This is my <u>dog</u> and that is **hers**.



Using "the" before a possessive pronoun

This book is mine







My coat is blue. Your is green.





Mixing up possessive adjectives and possessive pronouns.

My coat is blue. Your coat is green.

My coat is blue. Yours is green.





Possessive pronouns refer to a noun previously mentioned in the sentence.

Possessive adjectives are used before a noun that is being introduced to the sentence.



Those are his dogs and these are mines





Making possessive pronouns plural

Those are his dogs and these are mine





Possessive pronouns are always singular

Using apostrophes with possessive pronouns

Are these phones yours?





Apostrophes are only used with the "possessive S" structure, not with possessive pronouns




