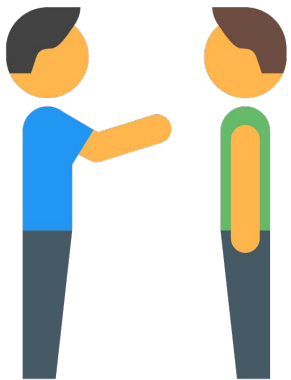

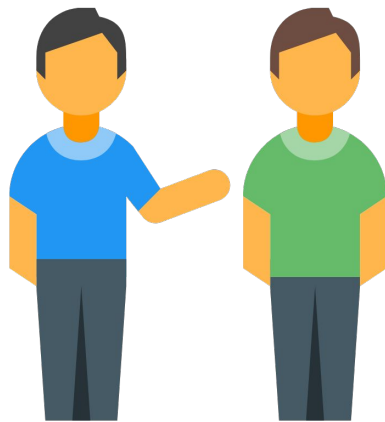

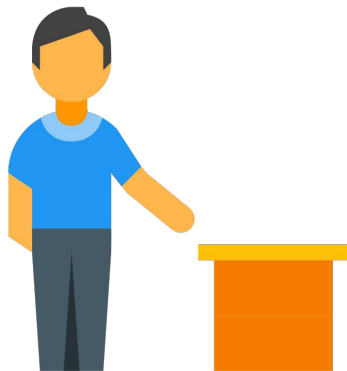
Possessive Pronouns

1) Asking a question about possession

*Why are there keys here. Are they
yours?*

Possessive Pronouns

2) Answering a question about possession

Whose book is this?
*It's **mine**!*

Possessive Pronouns

3) To avoid repetition

This is my dog and that is her dog.

*This is my dog and that is **hers**.*

Possessive Pronouns

Why are there keys here. Are they
yours?

Whose book is this?
It's *mine*!

This is my dog and that is *hers*.

Possessive Pronouns

Subject Pronoun (verb)	Possessive Pronoun (end / refer to previous noun)	Possessive Adjective (followed by a noun) My car, his book, their house
I	mine	my
you	yours	your
he	his	his
she	hers	her
it	its	its
we	ours	our
they	theirs	their

This is my car.

This is mine.

Using “the” before a possessive pronoun

This book is mine



Possessive Pronouns



My coat is blue. Your is green.



Possessive Pronouns

Mixing up possessive adjectives and possessive pronouns.

My coat is blue. Your coat is green.

My coat is blue. Yours is green.





Possessive Pronouns

Possessive pronouns refer to a noun previously mentioned in the sentence.

Possessive adjectives are used before a noun that is being introduced to the sentence.

Those are his dogs and these are mines



Possessive Pronouns

Making possessive pronouns plural

Those are his dogs and these are
mine



Possessive Pronouns



Possessive pronouns are always singular

Are these phones your's?



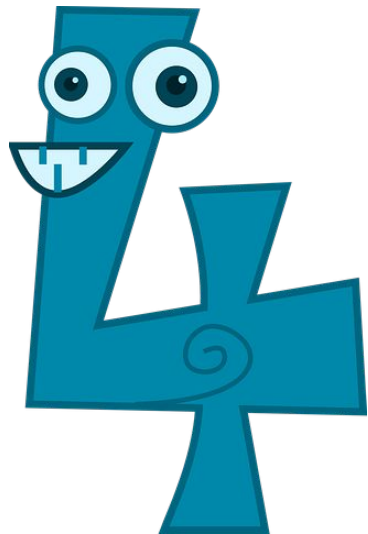
Possessive Pronouns

possessive pronouns

Are these phones yours?



Possessive Pronouns



Apostrophes are only used with the “possessive S” structure, not with possessive pronouns

Possessive Pronouns



I was with my sister and Fred was with
hers



Possessive Pronouns

Mixing the gender of possessive pronouns

IMPORTANT - OWNER

I was with my sister and Fred
was with his (sister)

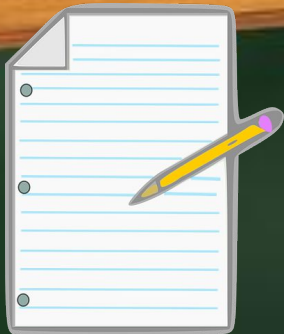
